In the beginning:

- Applied using planning template with headings/sections that helped with shaping proposal and narrowing down what we hoped to achieve/explore
- Refined plan with email and face-to-face support
- Received support with developing Statement of Ethical Conduct of Research

Goals

Working title

 Engaging apprentices in the construction industry in the online environment

Questions to help 'nail down' what we wanted to know

- What are the experiences of work-based learners who engage with online learning?
- What are the enablers and barriers to engage with online learning in a work-based context?

Research

- Mixed method approach
- 952 apprentices surveyed online
- 27 apprentices interviewed
- 27 apprentices invited to do an LNAAT assessment

Regular updates, meetings and feedback throughout

Some findings

- 3 themes emerged from interview responses-
- a) confidence and skills level
- b) device and connection type
- c) who and what is there to help

- Interconnected relationship between enablers and barriers emerged
- 4 'wrap arounds' when present act to enable online engagement
- If any one of the four is absent or inadequate this can be a barrier to effective engagement.
