Incident and accident reports - event cards for ordering

Purpose

The purpose of this resource is to demonstrate to learners the internal structure of an incident or accident report. Additionally, learners will develop sequencing and comprehension skills. Both of these skills will support learners' ability to write clear and concise incident and accident reports.

Instructions

- 1. Print and cut out one set of cards for each group.
- 2. Provide a set to each table and ask the group to put these into order.
- 3. Once finished, ask learners to look at the other groups.
- 4. Finally, discuss the report and its structure. Ask learners if it could be improved, if the sequence is a clear overview of events or if any parts could be removed.
