

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Ngā Tūhoe Iwi



Reo ā-iwi – Iwi Dialects

The absence of the digraph ‘ng’ - two letters that combine to form one sound – stands out in the Tūhoe dialect. So words such as tāngata (people) will become tānata and maunga becomes māuna. Another subtle difference are the pronouns mātou, rātou and tātou become mātau, rātau and tātau. Words such hei and kei are changed to hai and kai.

Other words used predominantly by Tūhoe people are:

Kāore = kāre for no/not

Teina = taina for younger sibling

Tūpuna/Tupuna = Tīpuna/Tipuna ancestor(s)


