Reflects the values and goals of the organisation

The unique principles and tenets of the te reo Māori teaching organisation should be reflected in the assessment and moderation processes.

Is relevant to the learner

Te reo Māori assessment and moderation should be authentic to the learner, be reflective on their needs and relative to their world.

Supports whānau, hapū and iwi aspirations The desires and needs of whānau, hapū and iwi must be part of successful assessment and moderation, as the development of the language should be led by the ambitions of the people.

Focuses on speaking, listening, reading and writing

Successful assessment and moderation for te reo Māori should focus on four main areas: speaking, listening, reading and writing, with a particular emphasis on speaking.

Is in a continuous state of change

Assessment and moderation for te reo Māori must be continuously changing to evolve with the needs of the language, learners and their whānau.
