Introduction

Sustainable organisational change is associated with the evaluative feedback's key themes: enhanced collaborative culture, increased capacity for cultural responsiveness, improved teaching practices, motivated and engaged staff, and continual professional development.

Manako and the international community

The Manako programme is internationally recognised through both the <u>New Zealand Dyslexia-Friendly Quality Mark</u> and the <u>Library of Congress 2023</u> <u>Literacy Honoree Award.</u>

The Manako programme demonstrates leadership and promotes tertiary teaching excellence to national and international educators through the Manako Communities of Practice, the PLD workshops and courses, resources, and the Manako webinar series.

Manako and research

Manako and the Ako Aotearoa Research and Innovation Agenda (AARIA) together support and promote research, applying thought leadership to research at the frontiers of tertiary education. For example, two current projects explore:

- » Al in tertiary education
- » Experiences of dyscalculic learners

Future change and development

2025 sees the development of a new professional learning and development model, as the Manako programme responds to the needs of the sector and educators' voices.

2025 will also see substantial change in tertiary education:

- » The <u>University Advisory Group</u> will provide the final report to the Ministry of Education in February 2025. Advice from the group is intended to inform policy changes.
- » The <u>Vocational Education and Training (VET) system reform</u> continues, following a consultation period August/September 2024.
- » Funding changes, for example, the <u>Apprenticeship Boost</u> will only be available for targeted sectors with skill shortages, from 1 January 2025.



The Manako team is ready to support this change. The Manako team is experienced in building the foundation learning capability of the tertiary education sector and remains firm in its integrity and its belief in the importance of a strong foundation in language, literacy, and numeracy (LLN) education, and cultural capability for educators who work with adult learners.
