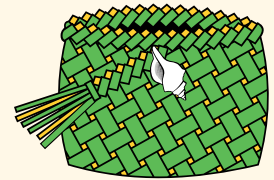

Who we are

Ako Aotearoa's Manako (previously ALNACC) programme is designed to support educators and organisations in building capability in Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) education, and fostering cultural capability. The Manako team supports the tertiary education sector through professional learning and development (PLD) courses, workshops and webinars, Communities of Practice, research projects, a wealth of resources, educator pathways, and whole-organisation initiatives, such as the Dyslexia-Friendly Quality Mark and the Tapatoru Ako Professional Practice Award.

The name *Manako* has a dual meaning; it means 'aspiration' or 'hope', but also encompasses the te ao Māori concepts of *Mana* (prestige, authority, status, charisma) and *Ako* (learning and teaching).

Dyslexia-Friendly Quality Mark

The New Zealand Dyslexia-Friendly Quality Mark (DFQM) recognises organisations that take a strategic approach to creating an inclusive environment for dyslexic learners. Tapatoru Ako Professional Practice Award

Tapatoru is a professional development framework, a reflective practice tool, and a whole-organisation approach to capability building. It is designed to enhance knowledge of Māori and Pacific cultural values, embedding language, literacy and numeracy, and neurodiversity, through a holistic, learner-centred approach. Manako offers a Tapatoru Individual Award for educators, and a Tapatoru Organisation Award for TEOs. Visit ako.ac.nz/tapatoru to learn more.
