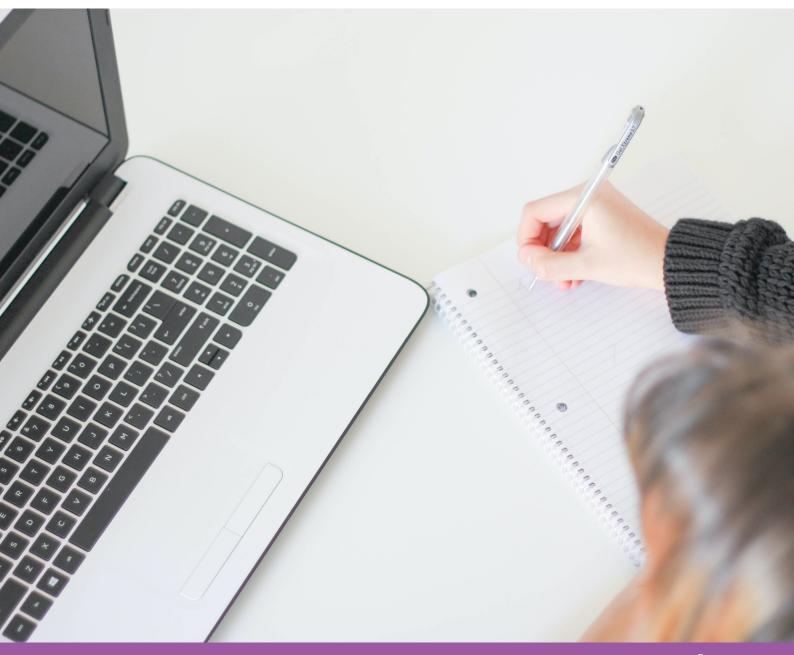

## Collaborative clusters

Groups of smaller organisations join together to gain benefits of our in-house offer.

Regional clusters of smaller organisations hold professional development opportunities on agreed topics, that benefit them all.

This is particularly suited to private training establishments and other community-based organisations.



### Mixed packages

For one organisation, with broader benefits to the region.

We tailor and deliver workshops to an organisation at agreed points throughout the year.

Other tertiary organisations in the area are invited to attend the PLD so they can embrace opportunities and benefit practitioners and learners across the region.



## Structured calendars

One organisation schedules PLD throughout the year with a final impact evaluation workshop to close the loop.

We liaise with HR, department heads, managers as required, to establish a year's professional development plan.

Dates are scheduled on a regular basis and a final 'impact' meeting is held with all attendees to gauge results.



### Bulk purchase and coupon codes

Provides a nofuss way for any organisation to book staff on our public workshops.

A total package is agreed to enable staff to attend our scheduled, public workshops, on a first-come first-served basis. Attendees book through our online event registration system using the code.

# Understanding the impact of our PLD in your organisation

Ako Aotearoa's impact evaluation process helps participants and managers gain a better understanding of how our workshops are contributing to positive change at both practitioner and organisational levels and the benefit to learners.

We follow up with participants after they have attended a workshop with three key questions:

- How have the staff attending this PLD incorporated the ideas into their work?
- In what ways are the changes impacting on their learners? How do they know?
- How is it contributing to department or wider organisational change?
